The role and commitment of a REGIONAL DELEGATE

- Prepare for meetings by reading all correspondence and bringing comments to the Committee meeting
 - on average 6 meetings per year held in Ross, or as otherwise advised
 - usually held on a Saturday
 - Transport costs covered
- Have commitment to meeting procedure;
- Act on agreed actions - who, when and how;
- Agenda issues from regions for discussion at Committee meetings;
- Report back to schools and regions accurately;
- Take a leadership role in regions;
- Be willing to participate on committees - internal and external;
- Understand and make decisions in alignment with TASSO Policy;
- Maintain awareness of current educational issues.
